## The Blessing of Children

(The leader is a parent or other responsible adult.)

Leader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy

Spirit.

ALL: AMEN.

Leader: Let us praise and thank the Lord, who took little children into

his arms and blessed them. Praised be the Lord now and

forever.

ALL: PRAISED BE THE LORD NOW AND FOREVER.

Leader: Jesus welcomed children and held them up as a model for all

who are seeking the kingdom of God. So we ask God's blessing that just as Jesus grew in knowledge, grace and wisdom before

the Lord, so too will the child(ren) in this place.

### **READING**

If possible, somebody other than the leader (perhaps a child or other youth) can proclaim the gospel:

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the holy gospel according to Mark:

Jesus blessed the children.

People were bringing children to Jesus that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to the disciples, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Then he embraced the children and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord

ALL: PRAISE TO YOU. LORD JESUS CHRIST.

#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM

The reader, or another reader, can lead this psalm.

Reader: We are his people: the sheep of his flock.

ALL: WE ARE HIS PEOPLE: THE SHEEP OF HIS FLOCK

The Reader reads each of the four verses, and everyone repeats the refrain between the verses:

Sing joyfully to the LORD, all you lands; serve the LORD with gladness;

come before him with joyful song. R.

Know that the Lord is God; he made us, his we are; his people, the flock he tends. R.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving, his courts with praise; Give thanks to him; bless his name. R.

For he is good: the LORD, whose kindness endures forever, and his faithfulness, to all generations. R.

Listen kindly to our prayers, we pray;

ALL: LOVING GOD, HEAR OUR PRAYER.

Leader: Watch over us throughout every day and night, we pray;

ALL: LOVING GOD, HEAR OUR PRAYER.

Leader: May we all grow in knowledge, grace and wisdom as did Jesus,

we pray;

ALL: LOVING GOD, HEAR OUR PRAYER.

Leader: Help all of the children throughout the world today, we pray;

ALL: LOVING GOD, HEAR OUR PRAYER.

Leader: Bless all of those who care for us and are good to us, we pray;

ALL: LOVING GOD, HEAR OUR PRAYER.

#### BLESSING OVER THE CHILDREN AND YOUTH

The leader(s), who may be one parent/adult, or both parents, can outstretch their arms and pray this blessing over the children:

Lord Jesus Christ,
you loved children so much that you said:
"Whoever welcomes a child welcomes me."
Hear our prayers and, with your unfailing protection,
watch over these children (this child)
whom you have blessed with the grace of baptism.
When they (he/she) have (has) grown to maturity,
grant that they (he/she) will confess your name in willing
faith,
be fervent in charity,
and persevere courageously in the hope of reaching your
kingdom,
where you live and reign for ever and ever.
