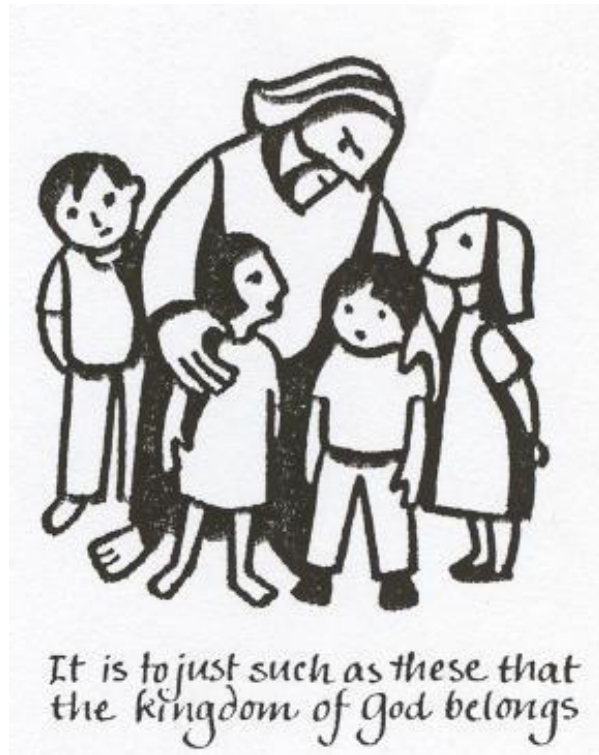

## Family Handbook 2020-2021

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## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **Registration**

All families who wish to register their children for the Parish School of Religion (PSR) and Junior Youth Ministry (JYM) Programs must first be registered with the parish. If your family is not registered with the parish, please call the Rectory Office and register before registering for PSR/JYM. PSR/JYM Registration packets will be mailed in May of each year to families of returning students. There are Registration Packs in the Gathering Room from June through September for new families who wish to register their children. Registration packets consist of: a cover letter, Registration Form, Emergency Medical Authorization Form and Photo Release Authorization Form. Children must be registered with all forms completed and submitted to the Religious Education Office prior to attending PSR/JYM Sessions on Sunday, September 13. Please contact the Religious Education Office at **330-659-6321** if you have questions about registering your children for PSR/JYM.

### **Fees**

The fee for the 2019-2020 PSR/JYM Program is \$60.00 per student with a \$180.00 family maximum. There is an additional Sacramental Fee for grades 2 and 8 of \$50.00 per student. All fees are payable before the first PSR/JYM session on **September 13, 2020**, however, no child will be denied a place in the program due to financial difficulty. Please contact the Religious Education Office if you have questions or concerns regarding fees.

### **Textbooks**

Students will receive their textbooks on the first day of PSR/JYM, Sunday, **September 13**. A Parent Orientation Meeting will be held during the first session of PSR/JYM. Since we have no room for storage at the middle school – **students will be responsible to bring to their textbook to each class they attend.** JYM grade 7 students will be issued additional materials from the “Discovering Program” and JYM grade 8 will be issued additional materials from the “Anointed in the Spirit” Confirmation Program. Grades 7 and 8 will be loaned a copy of the NAB Catholic Youth Bible.

### **Parental Involvement**

Parent volunteers are always needed in various areas of our Religious Education and Youth Ministry Programs. If you are interested in becoming a catechist, substitute catechist, classroom aid or hall monitor, please contact Darlene Bednarz in the Religious Education Office. All adult volunteers are required by the Dioceses of Cleveland to complete the VIRTUS Program (Protecting God’s Children) and have current fingerprinting and back-ground check on file in the Religious Education Office.

As parents, you are the primary teachers of your children, and family faith formation is essential for spiritual growth. Participation in Mass and PSR/JYM sessions is also an important part of your child’s on-going faith development. Please make every effort to attend regularly. It is also important to take time each week to review with your child any materials that are sent home. Materials may include: important memos, newsletters and the *Sharing Faith with My Family* page from each chapter. This is a great way to reinforce concepts covered in class and stay

informed as parents. **In the event that your child is absent from a scheduled class, refer to your child's syllabus and go over the material with your student at home.** When the child returns to class please ask the catechist if there were any handouts that they did not receive.

In addition, this year we are implementing a new program, "Families of Faith" that includes the students as well as their families. These Sunday morning events are listed on your calendar. We also included some "at home" classes that correspond with the dates when the Revere School System is closed on a Friday or Monday. This may include a link to a video that you can watch with your child and other materials that will be sent home the week before this at home class.

Parents should familiarize themselves with these PSR/JYM guidelines, and refer to the event schedules you will receive separately. Additional notices will be sent home on occasion and reinforced through email. Important PSR/JYM updates and reminders will be sent by email and will appear in the Saint Victor Parish Bulletin. On occasion Information Flyers will be sent home with the youngest or only child. The Parish Bulletin can be picked up in church on the weekend, and is also posted on the parish website at [www.saintvictorparish.org](http://www.saintvictorparish.org).

### **Attendance**

If your student will **not be attending** a regularly scheduled PSR/JYM Session, please notify Darlene Bednarz at the Religious Education Office as soon as possible. You may leave a message by phone [330 659-6321] or by email: [stvictorpsr@roadrunner.com](mailto:stvictorpsr@roadrunner.com). This will enable us to inform the catechist of their absence, and to make sure that if we have any PSR/JYM handouts that week we can send them home to you through your email.

### **Student Involvement**

Students benefit greatly by actively participating in weekly Mass, scheduled PSR/JYM sessions, Children's Liturgy of the Word, parish social events and service projects. Each child is blessed with special gifts and should be encouraged to share them with the Parish Community.

### **Classroom Rules in General**

All students are expected to be courteous and respectful toward teachers and other students at all times. Each catechist will set specific behavioral guidelines for his or her classroom which students will be expected to follow. Parents will be notified of any behavioral problems that cannot be resolved in the classroom.

Students should use the bathroom either before or after class but if they need to leave the classroom during class, they should go directly to the bathroom and return to class ASAP. This is especially important this year due to Covid. Younger students can be escorted to the bathroom during class by a classroom aide. (No loitering in the bathroom or hallways while class is in session.

Students are also expected to respect the property of Revere Middle School and the property of their students. Students are at **no time to go into an unused classroom or hallway.**

**Cell phones must be turned off** during PSR/JYM classes. If a student is using their cellphone for any reason, the catechist will ask them to turn the cellphone over to them until the class is over.

**Entrance and Dismissal Procedure - See Diagram of Pick-Up Traffic Flow on page 5**

Students in grades 2 – 8 are to enter Revere Middle School via the main entrance. Classes begin at 9:50 am and end at 11:10 am. Students should not be dropped off prior to 9:30 am, however they should be picked up promptly when class is over. Due to the large number of children being dismissed at the same time and in an effort to keep traffic moving more smoothly, we will be dismissing your children both at the main entrance and at the doors near the Gym. **Kindergarten and Grade 1 classes** will begin at 10 a.m. and end at 11:00 a.m. during this pandemic since parents are asked to come into the building to drop off and pick up their child(ren) to assure their safety. This will help with social distancing.

- **ALL Students** should enter the school through the **main entrance ONLY when being dropped off** for PSR/JYM.
- When stopping to drop-off or pick-up students, use the **curb lane ONLY** keeping the area directly in front of the building entrance open so that there is a clear path for pedestrians.
- **Please do not stop or park in the lane between the parking area of the lot and curb lane** as this is a safety hazard for the children and stops traffic from flowing freely. Also, those parked cannot pull out with a whole lane of cars stopped behind them.
- Traffic should **flow in one direction ONLY** at both pick-up locations.
- Please drive slowly (10 MPH or less) in the parking lot and exercise patience. There are nearly 200 students being picked up within a short period of time and it is important that we maintain a safe Christian environment for everyone participating in our PSR/JYM Program.
- **Students should wait in the designated areas ONLY – see map on page 5.** Students should be in view of the Traffic Monitors at all times – **NO waiting around the corners** of the building.
- In order to keep everyone safe and traffic moving during drop-off and pick-up of students on Sunday morning, please follow these guidelines

**Early Dismissal**

If it is necessary for a child to leave PSR/JYM early, a **signed note** from a parent or guardian must be **given to the Director of Religious Education**, and the child will be dismissed at the appropriate time. For the safety of children that are leaving early, **parents are asked to come into the school and sign them out at the front desk.** A PSR aide or staff member will then go to your child's classroom to pick up your child and escort them to you. .

## **Student Visitor Policy**

If it is necessary to have a friend visit with one of our student's **a written note must be sent with the visiting child which includes their name, emergency contact information and signature of their parent granting them permission to visit our PSR/JYM Program.** This note should be **presented to the Director** before the child is permitted into the classroom. This insures the safety of our visitor should an emergency arise. A visiting student should be a rare occurrence.

## **Covid Policy**

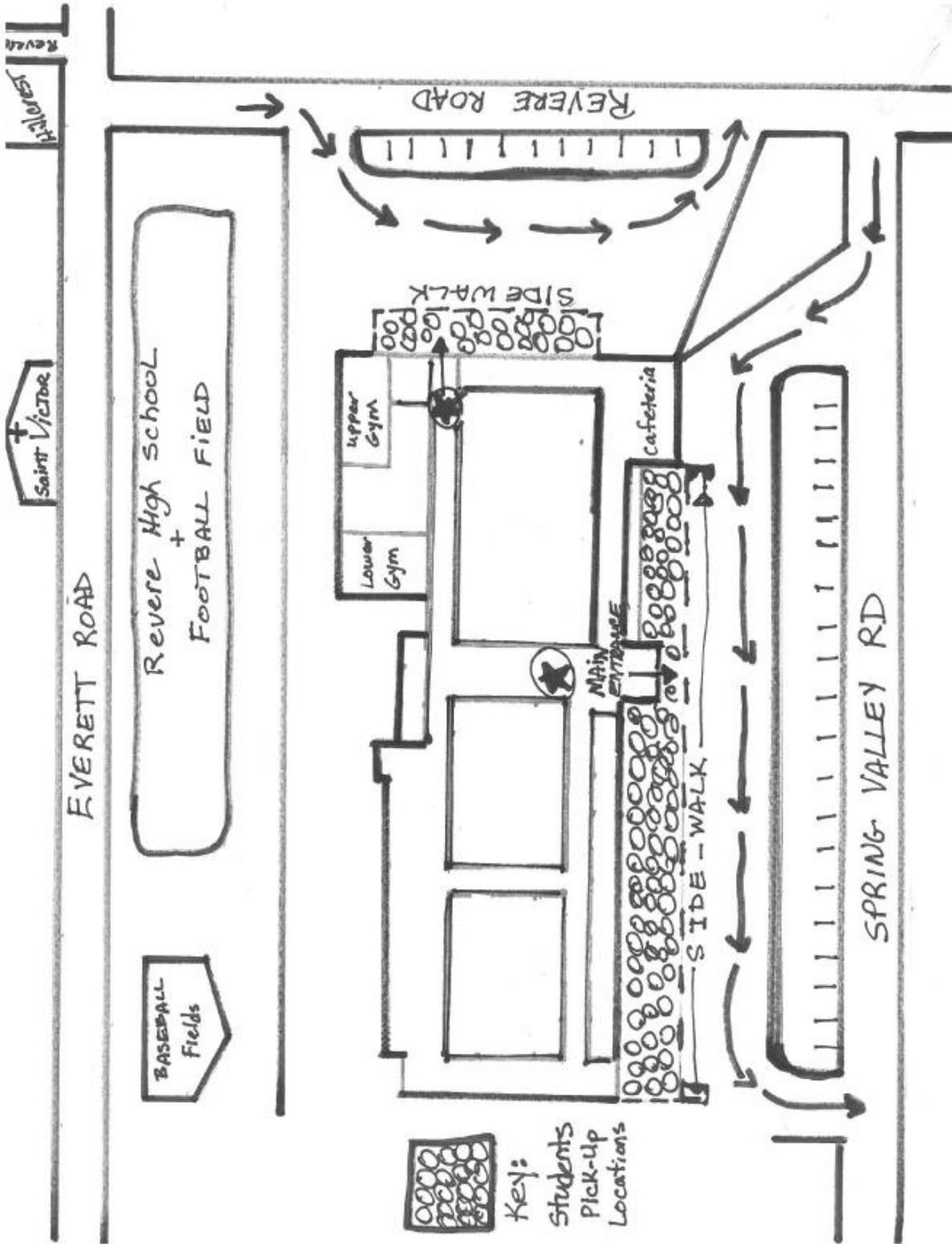
This may be a very differing looking year. All students, catechists, aids and visitors must wear a mask at all time. If your child is unable to wear a mask, they must use a shield.

"Go before you go" is important this year. We will need to keep bathroom visits to a minimum.

We will have hand sanitizers in each classroom. Please let us know if your child has any allergies to the ingredients found in them.

Materials will not be shared. Students will be provided with their own crayons, scissors, pencils and any other materials needed.

Email is more important this year than ever so we can contact you regarding any changes. It will also be necessary if we need to teach remotely. Please be sure you are receiving emails from St. Victor PSR.

## **CURRICULUM**

Saint Victor Parish School of Religion (PSR) and Junior Youth Ministry (JYM) is dedicated to partnering with the families of our parish community as they strive to enrich the faith life of their children and young teens. The PSR/JYM Program will support these efforts by providing a quality religious education for the children and teens of our parish, rich in the faith and traditions of the Roman Catholic Church. Our parish staff and volunteers are committed to sharing the message of the Gospel through Christian example, prayer, study and service. It is our hope that together we can build a strong foundation for our families, one that will inspire a deeper love for the Lord and continued growth in the knowledge and practice of our Catholic faith.

### **Parish School of Religion (PSR) Grades K through 6**

Our program for grades Kindergarten through 6 is “We Believe” published by Sadlier. The Sadlier “We Believe” Program addresses the needs of the child, the family, the catechist, and the Church community through:

- Content that is faithful to the teachings of the Catholic Church and that holistically embraces the four pillars of the Catechism: Creed, Liturgy and Sacraments, Moral Life, Prayer;
- Reliance on Scripture, Catholic social teaching, vocation awareness, and mission;
- Music and prayer which echo and anticipate liturgical celebrations;
- Methodologies that engage the experience of the child, modeled on Jesus’ “pedagogy of faith”;
- Reflection and activities which integrate catechesis, liturgy, and life;
- Media and technology used in service to faith and in the context of family;
- Review and assessment which reinforce the essential content of the lesson;
- Reflections and activities which involve the children and their families in catechesis, prayer, discipleship and life.

Each chapter includes a *Sharing Faith with My Family* page to be completed at home. These family pages invite participation in each chapter through prayer, activities, information and review. Activities and discussions on these pages are student-initiated, inviting the student to be the evangelizer.

### **Junior High Youth Ministry (JYM) Grades 7 and 8**

Our program for grades 7 and 8 is “We Live Our Faith” published by Sadlier. The student text enables today’s adolescents to get involved in learning and living their faith.

**Grade 7** will use Volume I: “We Live Our Faith” As Disciples of Jesus which centers on Jesus’ life, his teachings, and the sacraments he instituted. It presents Jesus’ call to each person to become his disciple and the ways in which his teachings, his sacraments, and his Church nourish people for discipleship. The “Discovering Program” Topic: “Growing Up Sexually” published by St. Mary’s Press will be integrated into the grade 7 curriculum.

**Grade 8** will use Volume II: “We Live Our Faith” As Members of the Church which presents the Church from its beginning at the Pentecost event through its history, encompassing its teachings and tradition. It presents the mission of the Church, entrusted to her by Jesus, as the responsibility of all baptized Catholics. The Confirmation Program “Anointed in the Spirit” published by Saint Mary’s Press will be integrated into the grade 8 curriculum.

## **Praesidium: Protecting God's Children**

In order to continually enhance the efforts of the Catholic Church regarding the protection of children and the creation of safe environments, the Diocese of Cleveland has adopted a new training program for parents and children. *Praesidium-Called to Protect*, a program which helps children protect themselves against sexual abuse, is now part of the required religious education curriculum for the Diocese of Cleveland. All children in St. Victor's PSR program grades K-6 will have the opportunity to participate in this program during the PSR year. Children in grades K-5 will participate in the program on Sunday during a regularly scheduled PSR session. Grade 6 will participate in the program on a Saturday morning in the Parish Hall. There will be a Parent Orientation Meeting in the Parish Hall so that you may become familiar with the program. Please see the PSR/JYM Schedules for dates and times of *Praesidium* sessions and the Parent Orientation Meeting.

## **Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW)**

Children's Liturgy of the Word is celebrated on Sunday at the 8:45 Mass during the PSR/JYM year. Liturgy of the Word with Children is a worship experience geared especially for children (ages 4-9). It mirrors the worship experience of the larger community, with a style that is engaging and interactive. Liturgy of the Word with Children offers an experience for the children to hear the Scriptures in words they understand and to share their own understanding of God's word. The catechist and teen volunteers lead the children in CLW in the Gathering Room during a Sunday morning Mass. There is a CLW schedule posted in the Gathering Room. All Confirmation students are required to assist in helping with CLW Session. (Please speak with Mrs. Bednarz about exceptions such as altar servers). Please sign up when the schedule is announced and posted. Scheduled CLW Sessions will be posted in the church bulletin.

## **SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION**

As members of the faith community, and as “primary catechists”, the first way parents can help to prepare their children for a sacrament is by their active participation in the celebration of the sacraments. Weekly participation in the Eucharist and regular participation in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation are important as children best learn the sacramental way of life by living it.

**It is expected that children who are preparing for the Grade 2 Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion be enrolled and attend Grade 1 PSR/JYM Sessions. It is expected that children who are preparing for the Grade 8 Sacrament of Confirmation be enrolled and attend Grade 7 PSR/JYM Sessions.**

### **First Reconciliation (Penance) – Second Grade**

As a parent of a child who is preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time, you are invited to experience with your child the gifts of joy, peace, forgiveness and new life that God offers through Jesus in this sacrament. It is through you that your child learns to relate to God and others. Your example of being open to receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation yourself will help your child value the gift of God’s forgiveness.

Our Family of Faith program which we ask that all parents attend, will include unit two of the “We Believe” Program to prepare grade two students for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The chapters in unit two will be used to help the children appreciate the wonderful gift of God’s forgiveness. Children will be learning the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes to use for an examination of conscience before confession and a prayer of sorrow to be said during confession.

Children preparing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and their families will meet at the church to view the confessional with Fr. Corrigan. At this time, Fr. Corrigan will also walk the children through the Rite of Reconciliation and allow them to practice. Please see the Second Grade Sacramental Schedule and the PSR/JYM Schedule for dates and times of First Penance, parent meetings and special events.

### **First Communion (Eucharist) – Second Grade**

Through the Sacrament of Baptism, your child was welcomed to new life in God’s family. Just as Baptism began your child’s initiation in the faith, preparing for First Eucharist continues this process as your child matures and grows in understanding and relationship with God, your family and the world. Through lessons in the “We Believe” text, children will gain an awareness that the Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine, is the real Body and Blood of Christ. They will gain a basic understanding that at Mass we praise and thank God for his goodness.

Our Family of Faith program which we ask that all parents attend, will include unit three of the “We Believe” Program to prepare grade two students for the Sacrament of First Communion after they receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Parents can also help their children prepare for the Sacrament of Eucharist by encouraging them to participate actively in the celebration of the Mass. You as parent along with the catechists will explain to the children the guidelines

about receiving Holy Communion and demonstrate correctly to them how Communion should be received.

Children preparing to receive the Sacrament of Eucharist for the first time will meet with Fr. Corrigan in the church to practice. Fr. Corrigan will walk them through the celebration of First Eucharist and let them sample a host and some wine. Please see the Second Grade Sacramental Schedule and the PSR/JYM Schedules for dates and times of the Sacrament of First Communion, parent meetings and special events.

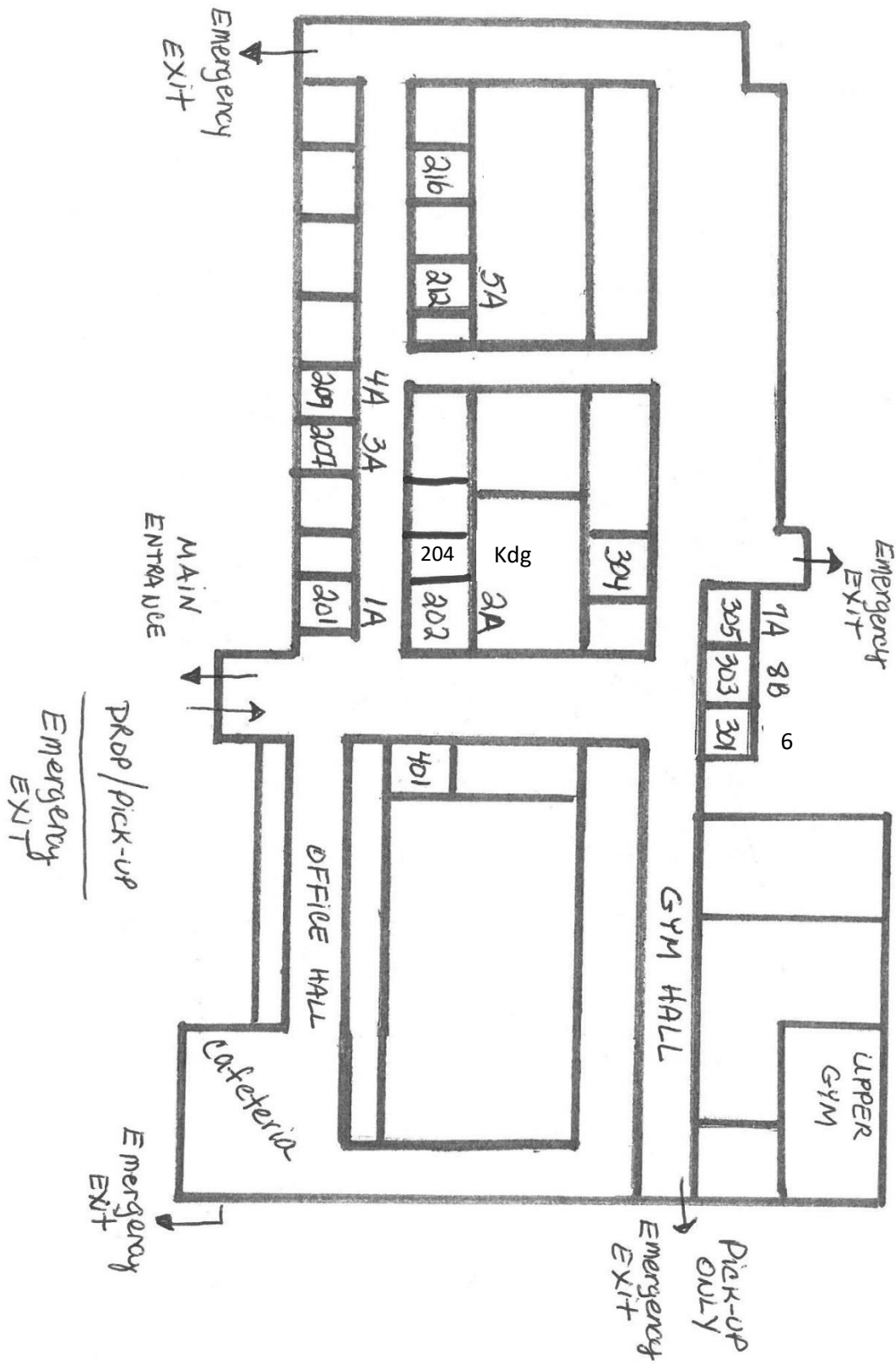
### **Confirmation – Eighth Grade**

The Sacrament of Confirmation is one of the three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. The word initiation refers to the formal process of joining an organization or a chosen way of life. Together these three Sacraments initiate Catholics into an ever growing relationship with Christ and his Church.

Through Baptism, we are reborn as we receive the grace of the Holy Spirit for the first time. We are born to a new life in faith. Confirmation completes the grace of Baptism. In Confirmation we receive a special strengthening of the Holy Spirit, which seals or perfects the grace of Baptism. Confirmation, as it is in Baptism, is so powerful that it imprints us with a special spiritual mark, or character. That is why Confirmation, like Baptism, can be received only once.

The Families of Faith Program will be part of the confirmation program. Parents can help their children prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation by attending the confirmation sessions as well as by encouraging them to participate actively in weekly Mass, Children's Liturgy of the Word, scheduled JYM and Confirmation sessions and retreat, special liturgies and social events, and service projects. Please see the Eighth Grade Sacramental Schedule and PSR/JYM Schedule for the dates and times of JYM and Confirmation Sessions, special liturgies and social events, Confirmation Retreat and Practice, and the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

(not to scale)



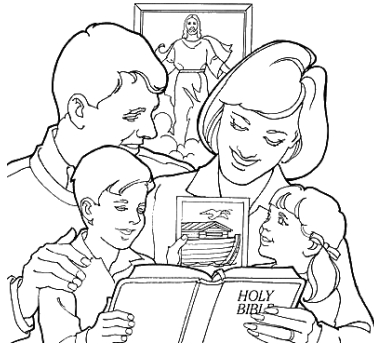
